

Camp Men-O-Lan - RESIDENT CAMP

WHAT TO BRING:

Label all items brought to Camp with campers first and last name.

Men-O-Lan is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

Note: All lost & found will be held for 30 days, after that time it will be donated.

DRESS CODE:

Campers must observe a modest dress code at all times. Because of camp activities, we recommend clothes that you don't mind getting dirty. Many campers like to dress up for Friday night's dress-up dinner. Campers must wear modest one-piece swimming suits (tankinis where there are no gaps between the top and bottom are acceptable). Shorts should be suitable for recreation and not overly tight or short (the bottom of shorts hem should meet finger tips with arms held straight at sides). Shirts should be suitable for recreation and not be revealing, overly baggy or tight. Spaghetti strap tank tops, shirts that bare the midriff and/or show cleavage are NOT permitted. Clothing with wording or images contrary to Christian principles, or wording of any kind across the back of shorts/pants may not be worn. Campers will be instructed to change if any attire is questionable.

RULES:

Campers are responsible to protect and respect the environment and the camp facilities. This includes keeping the grounds litter-free and graffiti-free. Any and all property damage will be charged to the offending parties. Other rules set by Camp Men-O-Lan Management shall be observed. Failure of any camper to observe the camps rules may result in expulsion.

PLEASE LEAVE AT HOME:

Please leave the following items at home as they are not permitted at camp: cell phones, CD/DVD players, Ipod/MP3 players, radios, video games, computers or tablets, tobacco, lighters, alcohol, drugs, nonprescription medications, knives, or weapons of any kind. These items will be confiscated for the week if discovered in a camper's possession.

VISITATION POLICY:

To ensure maximum safety and security for our campers and staff, we do not permit visitors during the camp week. You are welcome to join us for our closing circle at 7:00 p.m. on Friday (or Wednesday for Mini Week). In the event of a family emergency, please contact the Camp Office at 215-679-5144. You may stop by the Camp Office during regular office hours, Monday – Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. to drop off forgotten items.

PEANUT FREE:

For the safety of those campers with severe peanut allergies, Men-O-Lan is a 'peanut free' facility. Therefore, no products containing peanuts should be brought or sent to camp, ie: peanut butter sandwiches, candy, granola bars, etc.

RESIDENT CAMP PROCEDURES

Camper Check-In

REGISTRATION IS HELD SUNDAY FROM 3:30 – 4:00 PM. If you know that you will arrive after 4:00 PM, you must contact the Camp Office one week prior to your arrival date. FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR CAMPERS THE FRONT GATE WILL BE CLOSED IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING REGISTRATION.

PLEASE go through registration before you head to the cabin area.

LUGGAGE DROP OFF: A luggage drop off area will be clearly marked and our staff will deliver your camper's belongings to their cabin area.

PLEASE LABEL ALL BELONGINGS including luggage, sleeping bags, pillows, fans, etc. with camper's first and last name.

EZPASS REGISTRATION: This 'quick registration' process is available to campers who have paid in full AND completed all required paperwork ONE WEEK PRIOR TO THE START OF YOUR CAMP WEEK. No money will be collected at the EZPass line. If you wish to add camper store money on Sunday the camper must check in through the regular registration line. There will be registration signs directing you to our Auditorium and two clearly marked lines for EZPass and REGULAR registration. You will receive an email approximately one week prior to your camp week indicating your eligibility to use EZPass.

MEDICATIONS: Please bring any prescription or over the counter medications in its ORIGINAL CONTAINER. All medications must be given to the camp nurse. Prescription medications MUST be listed on the campers health form.

Camper Check-Out

CAMPER CHECK OUT: Authorized individuals will check out each camper with the campers counselor immediately following closing circle at the individual campers' cabin. Counselors will take campers back to their cabin following closing circle, please meet your camper there. The pickup person must be listed as authorized to pick up camper on the camper's registration form. THIS INCLUDES PARENTS OF CAMPERS, MAKE SURE TO INCLUDE PARENT'S NAME AS AUTHORIZED PICK UP PERSON. No camper will be released to someone not listed as authorized. If you have more than one child at camp, each child must be checked out individually with their specific counselor.

The front gate will open at 6:45 p.m. Please do not proceed down into camp before that time.
