

Be a Camp Men-O-Lan Nurse!



Role's Title and Main Requirement: Camp Nurse; preferably Registered Nurse, but minimum Licensed Practical Nurse qualification

Role's Time Frame: A single or multiple weeks between June 28 and August 20, 2021

What does our Camp Nurse do?

The Men-O-Lan Nurse takes care of camper and staff injuries, treats un-well kids and adults, administers medication, stays in contact with parents whose children were injured at Camp, and recommends final decisions regarding sending campers or staff home due to communicable illness. They work with both Resident and Day Camp while those are both in session.

The Camp Nurse is present at check-in and check-out for Resident Camp, and for Monday morning check-in for Day Camp. At the time of camper check-in he or she conducts a quick health and lice check with the help of designated staff members.

The Camp Nurse carefully follows and enforces Camp Men-O-Lan's health protocol, including COVID-19 prevention and mitigation and our Communicable Disease Plan.

What are the minimum requirements for our Camp Nurse?

During Resident Camp weeks the Men-O-Lan Nurse must stay on site 24 hours a day, because our campers are here overnight as well. These sessions start on Sunday afternoon, and end Friday evening (except for Mini Camp, which ends Wednesday Evening). During Day Camp sessions the Camp Nurse must stay on site during the regular program, from 9am to 4:30pm, or later if there is a special evening activity (i.e. Pool Party). They must be at check-in (Sunday, 3:30pm) and check-out (Friday, 7pm) for Resident Camp, and at Monday morning check-in for Day Camp (Monday, 8:30am).

As for qualifications, the Camp Nurse must be either a Registered Nurse, or a Licensed Practical Nurse.

Every staff member and volunteer must complete and submit a copy of all three background checks that are required by the State of Pennsylvania for those who work with and around children and youth. Please note that if your spouse or children 15 years and older are staying with you they also need to submit these clearances.

What can we offer to our Camp Nurse?

For each week a Camp Nurse spends with us, we offer a \$200 compensation, and free Day Camp if they have eligible children. We also provide three meals a day and accommodation in a cottage for the Nurse and his or her family. They are welcome to participate in camp worship and Bible time. (Please note that children of staff members and volunteers cannot be left unattended.)

What is the ideal Camp Nurse like?

A Men-O-Lan Nurse has to be caring, knowledgeable, a good detective and a good listener. They have to be confident and quick problem solvers. They must have good communication and administrative skills. If they are here during a Resident Camp session, they must be prepared to stay up late, and even to be

awakened in the middle of the night (although this seldom happens). Last but not least, they must love Jesus!

What is the process of assigning a Nurse to a camp session?

Because it is crucial that we have a nurse on site during Resident Camp sessions, these five weeks (June 28-July 31) are the first ones we fill. Once these weeks are covered, we start filling the remaining three Day Camp weeks. If a nurse candidate is only available for a Day Camp session, we will put them on hold until the Resident Camp weeks are fully covered.

2021 Camp Sessions

The Camp Nurse works with both Resident and Day Camp while they are both in session.
